Emergency Services

Boston Emergency Services Team (BEST) 1-800-981-4357 The BEST team offers immediate referrals, psychiatric evaluation, crisis interventions and treatment, a short term Community Crisis Stabilization Program (3-5 day voluntary stays), and referrals for ongoing treatment. The Call Center is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and can provide support, referrals, arrange in-person evaluations, and dispatch mobile clinicians to intervene at the location of crisis.

Emergency Services Program Mobile Crisis Intervention 1-877-382-1609 The ESP/MCI provides crisis assessment, intervention, and stabilization services without a visit to the emergency room. Services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and are of no cost to those with MassHealth, Medicare, or with those who are uninsured.

Boston Trauma Response Team

555 Amory Street, Suite 300, Boston, MA 02130 1-617-431-0125 Justice Resource Institute's Trauma Response Team aims to promote resilience for Boston community members impacted by violence/homicide. The team provides immediate emotional support for victims and helps with arrangements of basic needs (i.e. shelter, food, clothing, transportation, family contact) and liaisons relations between victims and emergency and hospital authorities. Additionally, coping and stabilization groups are provided post-event in addition to care coordination and referrals.

<u>Acute Psychiatry Service at</u> <u>Massachusetts General Hospital</u>

The Child Trauma Training Center's centralized referral system which makes trauma focused referrals for ages 0-22. Calls from parents, caregivers and child-serving professionals are screened for trauma exposure and symptoms and referrals are made within one business day. Trauma reading materials related to exposure and symptoms, information of the healing process of trauma and evidence based practices are provided for parents and caregivers.
